More Ways to Support Florida Panthers

The Florida Museum of Photographic Arts in Ybor City is currently showcasing a collection of Mr. Ward's photographs. This captivating exhibition celebrates Florida's wild heart through the story of our state animal - the Florida panther. The photographs in the exhibit, which are featured in the new

National Geographic film and book, Path of the Panther, provide an unprecedented portrait of the panther amidst Florida's wildest landscapes. From the remote cypress swamps of the Fakahatchee Strand, to the headwaters of the Everglades, the photographs will transport viewers into a hidden Florida that deserves to be seen and protected.

The exhibit is on view through March 17, 2024. The museum is located at 1630 E. 7th Avenue Ybor in Tampa. Admission is \$10-12. Learn more <u>HERE</u>.

And a new Protect the Panther license plate, now available to Florida motorists, features a striking photograph taken by Mr. Ward in 2018 of the first female panther documented north of the Caloosatatchee River since 1973, along with her kitten.



The new license plate can be purchased at the Florida Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles or by checking with your local tax collector office for availability. Fees from the license plate go directly into the Florida Panther Research and Management Trust Fund, which is a critical source of funding for the states's panther-related research, monitoring, and conservation efforts.
