Today is May 1, 2024, the day the 6-week abortion ban goes into effect in Florida. I just finished an interview with Bay News 9 where we talked about what it means. With all of the confusion surrounding the trial of the 15-week abortion ban, many are unaware that the 6-week abortion ban is now the law in Florida. There is no expiration on this law.



It can only be changed by **passing Amendment 4 in November**. The majority of Floridians believe we deserve the freedom to make personal medical decisions without interference from politicians. # In with the New Voter Registration Form; Out with the Old!

A new paper **Voter Registration (VR)** Application (DS-DE 39) became effective on April 24. The Supervisor of Elections WILL NOT accept the previous forms, so please throw any old forms you have into your recycle bin. There is no change in the process of registering voters. We will continue to provide blank voter registration forms to voters and we will NOT collect them.

We will have the new voter registration forms at our events. A new law requires the SOE to print the 3PVRO number on any VR applications they provide so do not obtain forms from the SOE. Instead, download the forms from the Division of Elections or individual SOE websites in English, Spanish, and Creole. The English and Spanish versions are also available on the Voter Registration page of our website.

The new forms are dated 4/24/2024, have a QR code, and include the statements about 3rd party voter organizations' responsibilities. We all know how important it is for citizens to vote; please take VR seriously this year.

# **NPV Victory**

No! It's not an infectious disease! It's the National Popular Vote and, on April 15, 2024, Maine became the 18th state to enact a National Popular Vote law.

We in Florida are grateful that Rep. Mike Gottlieb sponsored HB67 and Sen. Victor Torres sponsored SB 236 during the 2024 Legislative Session. We will continue to work toward its passage in the next Florida session.

#### The National Numbers:

• 18 jurisdictions have passed NPVIC;


- 209 electoral votes have been secured;
- 270 votes are need to elect the President; and, thus,
- 61 more votes are needed for the compact to go into effect.
