As I kick off my third year as President, I want you to know how much I appreciate working with you all and would like to invite any of you still looking for the right league activity for you to reach out to me. In this election year, we will be working hard to increase voter turnout in Hillsborough and Pasco Counties. Increasing voter turnout among younger voters has long been a priority for our league as well. We often have other Hillsborough and Pasco organizations reach out to collaborate on this and many other important issues.

League members help to coordinate our local partnerships with the Sierra Club, Food & Water Watch, PTA, Families for Strong Public Schools, NAACP, Urban League, Alpha Kappa Alpha, Moms Demand Action, and many more. ## **Annual Meeting Report**

We were pleased to welcome about 40 League members to our May 18th Annual Meeting, where we enjoyed time visiting with one another, as well as discussing and voting on the business matters of our League for the coming year. Congratulations to Greg Vawter who won the pair of Straz *Clue* tickets donated by Elizabeth Belcher!

Welcome to our new board members, Cheryl Umberger, Christina Conti, and Emily Hinsdale, as well as new treasurer Johanne Castagan. A new budget for the coming year, lower than previous years, passed, with a number of changes that streamlined and combined categories to make the budget easier to manage. We passed changes to our bylaws, primarily updating our League name to the LWV of Hillsborough and Pasco Counties. We also approved the framework for our 2024-25 program, which offers broad guidelines for the issues we will work on in the coming year. Several items in the

program were amended during the meeting, and we encourage all members to review the entire document.

## 2024 Voting Dates

#### **Primary Elections**

July 22, 2024 - Deadline to register to vote in Primary Elections; Deadline to change party affiliation for Primary Elections

August 5-18 - Early Voting and drop-off of Vote-by-Mail ballots at 21 locations in Hillsborough County

August 10-17 - Early Voting and drop-off of Vote-by-Mail ballots at 12 locations in **Pasco County** 

August 8 - Deadline for requesting Vote-by-Mail ballot; please allow at least a week for your completed ballot to reach the offices of the County Supervisors of Elections (SOE).

August 20 - Primary Elections Day - Vote at your local precinct or drop Vote-by-Mail ballots off at an office of the SOE. Dropped off and mailed ballots must be received by 7:00 p.m. at the SOE's office.

#### Also...

On election days, Vote-by-Mail ballots may only be delivered to office of the Supervisor of Elections, NOT to polling places. The Hillsborough SOE has offices in Tampa, Riverview, and Ruskin. The Pasco SOE has offices in Dade City, New Port Richey, and Land O'Lakes.

As in previous election years, for the 2024 elections, our chapter will publish Vote411 online voter guides for Hillsborough and Pasco County races, providing candidate-specific information for voters. Angie Pickren (Hillsborough) and Barbara Sheppard (Pasco) are creating the guide. Members are currently gathering candidates' campaign data and writing questions for candidates to answer.

Starting July 12, voters can go to the Vote411 website, enter their addresses, preview the candidates on their Primary ballots, and learn about the candidates before making a voting plan. The voter guides will be updated and published again on September 20 for the General Election.

## Reproductive Rights

Did you hear? Abortion is on the ballot this November in Florida.

The state-wide umbrella organization overseeing the campaign to get 60% of voters to vote yes is Floridians Protecting Freedom.

We know that Floridians overwhelmingly agree: abortion is a personal medical decision that should be free from government interference. We also know that the repercussions of an abortion ban extend far beyond abortions. Doctors will be fearful of taking actions that could be construed as abortions. Women with medical conditions or with fetuses with medical conditions will be sent home until they are in danger of dying before they can access essential health care. OB/GYNs will leave Florida for states where they don't

need to worry about going to jail. (It is already happening.) Women in healthy pregnancies with wanted children will have a harder time seeing qualified medical personnel. Women will be increasingly steered towards anti-abortion centers where health care providers will lie to them about how far along they are in their pregnancies as a strategy to keep women from aborting.

Did you know there are 192 anti-abortion pregnancy centers operating across Florida? Sometimes calling themselves "crisis pregnancy centers", these anti-abortion pregnancy centers deceive and shame Floridians seeking comprehensive reproductive health care including abortion care. Many of these are state-funded with taxpayer dollars: in 2023, Gov. Ron DeSantis allocated \$25 million a year towards these centers. Don't believe The Voter? Read here.

- Donate to the campaign. Opponents continue to try to slow down our efforts, which is why we can't lose momentum. Every dollar helps us get closer to protecting abortion access for Floridians.
- Spread the word on social media. Let others know that we need their help to remove government interference from our personal medical decisions.
- Talk to your neighbors! Even your Catholic and conservative voters may be concerned about prenatal health care and/or government interference in our lives.
- Talk to strangers. Wear a button referring to Amendment 4 and conversations will happen in shops, restaurants, and elsewhere.
- Use Amendment 4 as a talking point during voter registration. It's a winner. Just remind potential voters that it's not enough to vote yes on 4; they also need to vote for pro-choice candidates.
- Remember -- 100% of pregnancies can be linked to men. Thus, 100% of men should be voting yes on Amendment 4. Don't discount their weight in elections.
- Join Floridians Protecting Freedom in weekly calls to invite voters to take action and support "Yes on 4" this election cycle. No experience necessary!
- Join Equality Florida this month Pride Month in their events in support of Amendment 4.

Cooperation continues between the HCLWV and Tampa Walls on a mural to encourage voter participation. We are close to agreeing with a building owner on the canvas or wall and we have the on-line portfolios of eight fabulous, local, female muralists to review. Now we need to decide whose works we like the most. Who would like to help evaluate the works of these eight artists? Once we've narrowed the list down and know the dimensions of the wall, we will ask a few to submit site-specific designs to us. We also might want to come up with guidelines and criteria for the designs. What do we want to say in words? What do we want the painters to depict visually? When the muralists come back to us with their designs, Teresa Potter makes the final decision.

We are still hoping to get the mural done before the July 22 voter registration deadline. Gulp.
