Sandy Grant, in Memoriam

Sandra "Sandy" Grant, 82, of Kokomo, passed away peacefully on Sunday, June 16, 2024. Please help us celebrate the life of a long time league member. The youngest of 12 children, Sandy Schaefer Grant was born in Kokomo, Indiana in 1942. She majored in elementary education and was an outstanding, passionate teacher at Seffner Elementary School for many years. Sandy and her husband, "Grant" Grant, resided in the East Lake area. The HCLWV was enriched by Sandy's active participation. As her close friend Patricia Moran stated, "she was a force." Nothing done by Sandy was halfway; her character, intellect, integrity, and sense of humor were legendary to those of us lucky enough to have known her.



Sandy lobbied for the teachers union and famously stated," I vote 12 times each election by virtue of the people I influence!"

After Sandy retired from teaching, she moved back to Kokomo. The League of Women Voters in Indiana was resurrected by the "always in charge" Sandy. The editor of the Kokomo paper asked Sandy to sit in on editorial board meetings and attend government meetings and they knew not to cross her!

Vote411 on 7/12

Get out your reading glasses! Vote411 on-line voter guides for Hillsborough and Pasco County races will be on-line on **July 12**. Vote411 provides candidate-specific information for voters. Angie Pickren (Hillsborough) and Barbara Sheppard (Pasco) are creating the guide. Members are currently gathering candidates' campaign data and sorting their answers to our questions.

All voters will be able to go to the Vote411 website, enter their addresses, preview the candidates on their ballots, and learn about the candidates. The voter guides will be updated and published again on September 20 for the General Election.

2024 Voting Dates - August Primary

- July 22, 2024 Deadline to register to vote in Primary Elections; Deadline to change party affiliation for Primary Elections
- August 5-18 Early Voting and drop-off of Vote-by-Mail ballots at 21 locations in Hillsborough County
- August 10-17 Early Voting and drop-off of Vote-by-Mail ballots at 12 locations in Pasco County
- August 8 Deadline for requesting Vote-by-Mail ballot; please allow at least a
 week for your completed ballot to reach the offices of the County Supervisors of
 Elections (SOE).
- August 20 Primary Elections Day Vote at your local precinct or drop Vote-by-Mail ballots off at an office of the SOE. Dropped off and mailed ballots must be received by 7 p.m. at the SOE's office.

Also...

On election day, Vote-by-Mail ballots may only be delivered to office of the Supervisor of Elections, NOT to polling places. The Hillsborough SOE has offices in Tampa, Riverview, and Ruskin. The Pasco SOE has offices in Dade City, New Port Richey, and Land O'Lakes.

The LWVFL is beta-testing a new voter concierge program, part of a series of Center for Artistic Activism (C4AA) works that protect the freedom to vote with creativity and innovation. Hillsborough Education Foundation (HEF) strongly advocates for registered voters in Hillsborough County to support the upcoming Hillsborough County Millage for Public Schools when it appears on ballots this fall. This critical vote will determine whether Hillsborough County can secure the necessary funding to compensate our educators and support staff adequately, improve our public education system, and ultimately ensure a brighter future for our community.

But Not to TECO

As a partner in the Hillsborough Affordable Energy Coalition, HCLWV is participating in a No Rate Hike Pledge, calling on elected officials to oppose electricity rate hikes. The Pledge launched two weeks before a June 13 hearing on TECO's proposal to raise the average residential bill to at least \$160.93 in January 2025 - an increase that amounts to over \$200 more annually per household. Last year, Tampa Electric customers paid the third highest bills in the nation.

Earlier in the month, the Coalition announced the pledge just before County Commissioner Gwen Myers' Gibsonton Town Hall and immediately requested her signature. Advocates have been calling all Commissioners to stop the proposed rate hikes on behalf of their constituents and pass an affordable energy and climate plan. Commissioner Myers refused to sign the document to oppose profit-driven rate hikes, which would help struggling families.

On June 13, in rare Public Service Commission hearings, dozens of Tampa Bay residents told utility regulators how their families' finances were threatened by the affordable housing crisis, inflation, and high utility bills.

Prior to the hearings, held at HCC Brandon, the Coalition led a small protest outside the hearing room. The HCLWV Environment and Climate Change Action Group was represented by Stephen Kauffman, the League's liaison to the Coalition. The Coalition protest was covered by many local media outlets.

We need to continue standing in opposition to corporate greed and TECO's continued use of fossil fuel.



Juneteenth and Voters

League members shared information with voters during the Juneteenth Celebration in Port Richey sponsored by the African American Club of Pasco. We reminded voters about

the upcoming Aug. 20 primary election and that vote by mail requests expire every two years now. We also promoted the League's VOTE411 website for candidate information.



We Live in an Amazing Neighborhood!

Cindy Wilson represented our League at a June 13 meeting hosted by the St. Pete LWV and joined by the N. Pinellas and Manatee Leagues.

Some notable accomplishments or interesting ongoing or future projects:

- The St. Pete League got a grant related to Yes on 4 for yard signs and bumper stickers.
- St. Pete's social justice team is planning a panel discussion on immigration for later this summer.
- St. Pete has a monthly book club/discussion group.
- St. Pete has sent thousands of postcards to returning citizens through postcard parties and other events.
- St. Pete does VR at city recreation centers 4-6 pm, when parents are picking kids up. St. Pete members also visit senior centers.
- St. Pete makes use of a Voting Issues Survey visual aid that is available from the State League and engages voters in conversations about which issues matter to them
- There will be a hybrid meeting on July 9 about NPV.
- St. Pete has gotten two grants to create native habitats and rain gardens locally.
 School groups visit the gardens. If anyone likes to garden, they could use some volunteers from our side of the Bay.
- · N. Pinellas is organizing three fora with candidates.
- N. Pinellas works with a church on helping returning citizens get information about voting rights.
- N. Pinellas hosts fora on education with area PTAs.
- N. Pinellas has adopted a mile of a street in Dunedin and coordinates with a elementary school located on that strip.
- N. Pinellas hosts family picnics.
- Manatee County has a program called "Why is Voting Important?"
- Manatee members are teaching a class on voting at a local high school and working
 with the Civics Club at that school. In the coming academic year, they will be
 working with Civics Clubs in a number of schools. They have created voting games
 for use with the clubs.
- Other leagues are holding monthly happy hours and/or other events open to members for networking.

We Are Seeing Red

Did you hear? Reproductive Rights are on the ballot this November in Florida.

This is not just about reproductive rights. This is about the right to make personal medical decisions, the ability to find quality gynecological care, the availability of emergency procedures at hospitals, the health of pregnant women and girls, and access to accurate information about our own pregnancies and options.

Floridians overwhelmingly agree. Now we have to make sure they vote yes on Amendment 4 in November and for candidates who also believe that health decisions should be made by patients and doctors and not by judges or politicians.
