Thank you to those who helped at events in July; we were busy! And thank you to those who have signed up to help at USF and HCC for National Voter Registration Day and additional on-campus events and to those of you who have offered to coordinate events at some Goodwill locations.

I was recently informed that there is a 10% voting gap between community college students and those at public four-year universities.

To counter this, the <u>Community College Concert Competition</u> was launched by Levi Strauss, Showtime/MTV Studios, and several other organizations. HCC is aware of it, but the <u>Students Learn Students Vote Coalition</u> has asked us to help spread the word to other community college campuses. This competition is a nationwide, nonpartisan student voter turnout campaign and entry is EXCLUSIVE to community colleges. The winning campus will host a free concert by a major recording artist on Vote Early Day, October 29th.

Save the Date for Election Security

How might emerging technologies, such as artificial intelligence, as well as everyday digital and social media platforms, present challenges to and opportunities for the integrity of American elections? In a sea of information, detecting what content is correct, incorrect, and manipulated can be a difficult task. Feeling empowered to vote and confident in the integrity of American elections requires understanding the information available to each of us. Community officials, political analysts, and researchers come together for this panel to discuss how we can prepare to be better content consumers and decision-makers this election season.

This conversation, moderated by journalist Briona Arradondo of Fox 13 Tampa Bay, features expertise from Hillsborough County Supervisor of Elections Craig Latimer, political analyst and USF Professor Emerita Dr. Susan MacManus, Director of the USF Center for Sustainable Democracy Dr. Joshua Scacco, and Dennis Mont'Ros with the USF Center for Leadership and Civic Engagement.

This event is part of the USF College of Arts and Sciences Democracy and Citizenship Speaker Series, **co-sponsored by the League of Women Voters of Hillsborough and Pasco Counties**, the Center for Sustainable Democracy, and the Humanities Institute. 2024 Voting Dates - August Primary

The deadline has passed for registering to vote or changing registrations in time for the Aug. primaries. Please remind your friends and family about the remaining deadlines.

- August 2 Last date recommended for requesting mail-in-ballots, although requests will still be taken through Aug. 8. Please allow at least a week for your completed ballot to reach the offices of the County Supervisors of Elections (SOE).
- August 5-18 Early Voting and drop-off of Vote-by-Mail ballots at 21 locations in Hillsborough County.
- August 10-17 Early Voting and drop-off of Vote-by-Mail ballots at 12 locations in Pasco County.
- August 20 Primary Elections Day Vote at your local precinct or drop Vote-by-

Mail ballots off at an office of the SOE. Dropped off and mailed ballots must be received by 7 p.m. at the SOE's office.

The **Hillsborough SOE** has offices in Tampa, Riverview, and Ruskin. The **Pasco SOE** has offices in Dade City, New Port Richey, and Land O'Lakes.

Remember...

On election day, Vote-by-Mail ballots may only be delivered to office of the Supervisor of Elections, NOT to polling places.
